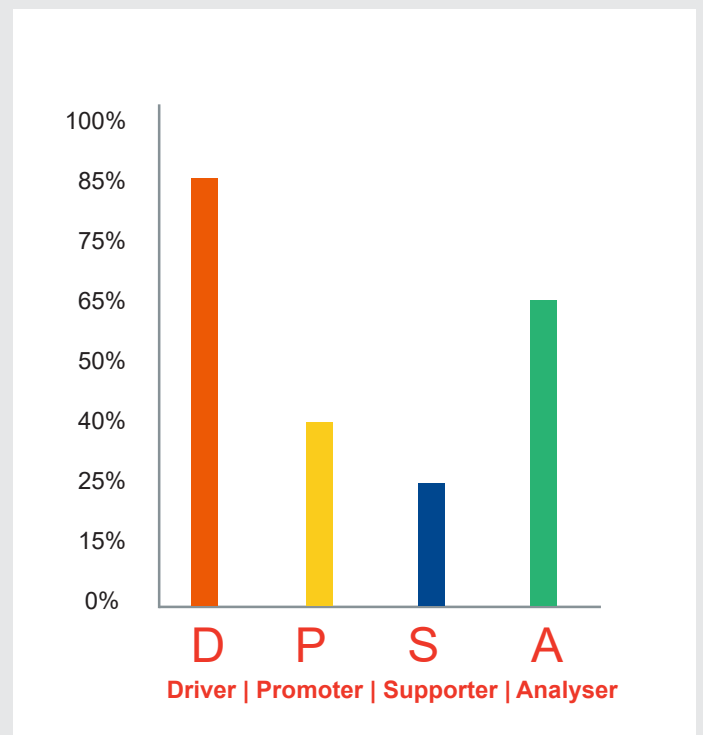

All styles can succeed or fail. What's important is what you do with your talents, skills and education.

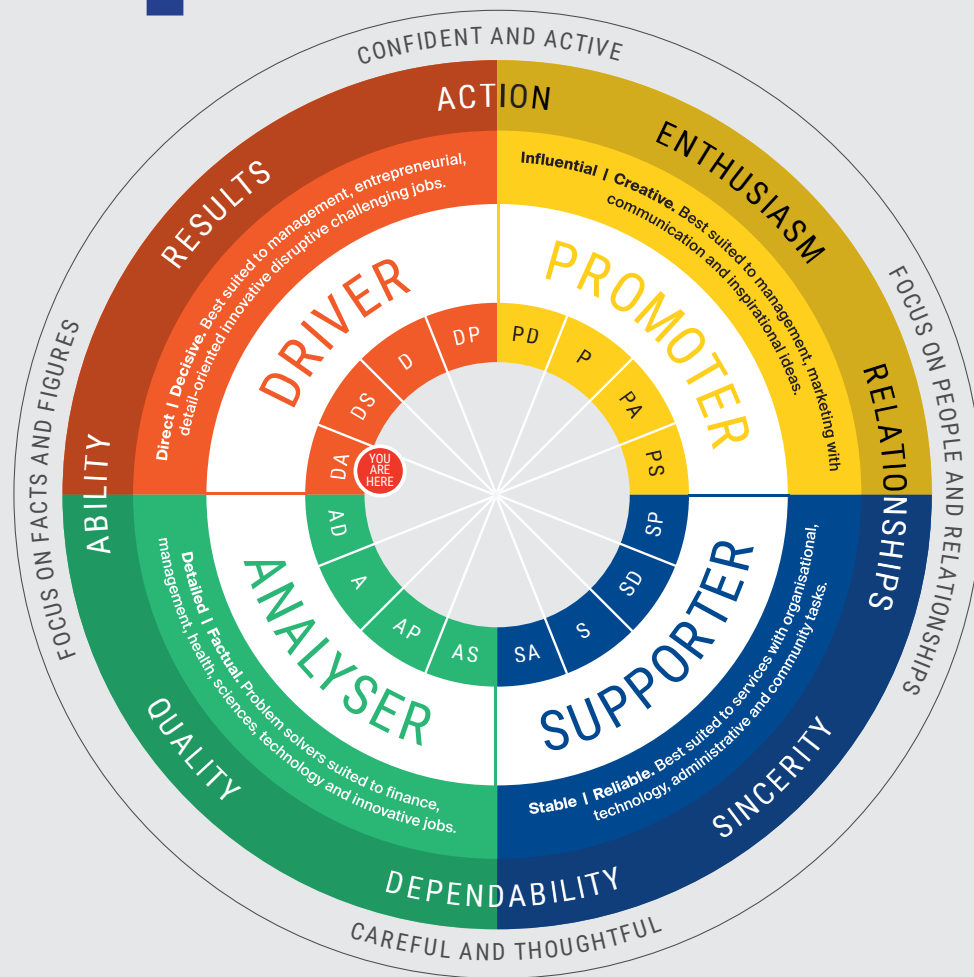
Your personality graph

The Map is divided into the four MiTrade Personality styles, DRIVER | PROMOTER | SUPPORTER | ANALYSER, and combinations of each style (DA, DP, DS etc.). Your style is shown as 'YOU ARE HERE'. The outer circle represents 'what you focus on' and 'how you approach life'. A Driver focuses on facts and figures and is confident and active; a Supporter focuses on people and relationships and is careful and thoughtful. The inner circle represents 'what's important to you' - for Drivers it's results and for Promoters it's enthusiasm.

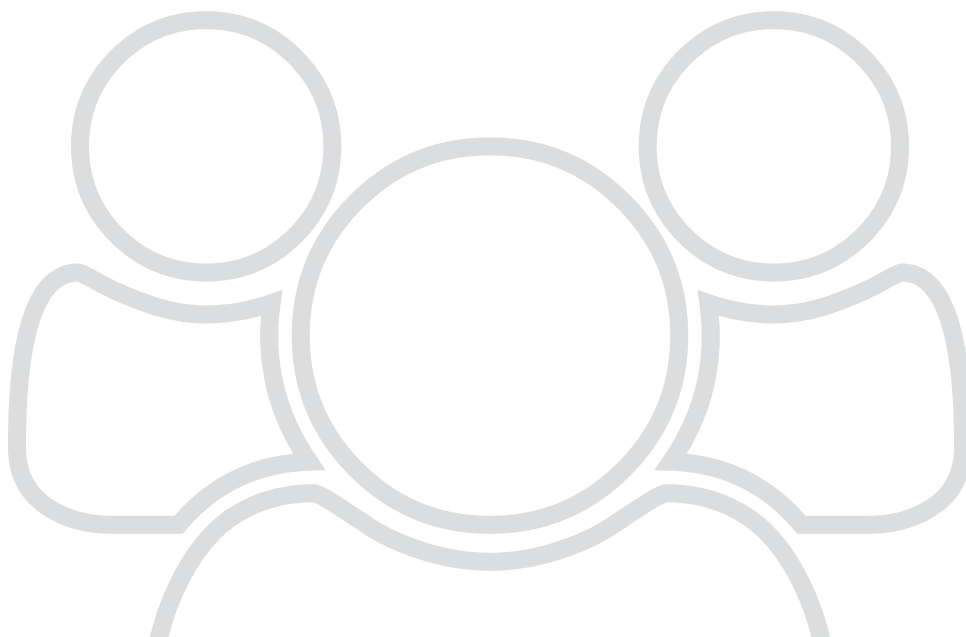
